YOU can make a difference in the lives of those affected by domestic violence by donating your old and used cell phones. Donated cell phones will be sold, refurbished or recycled and the proceeds will benefit SHALVA. Each cell phone is worth an average of \$4.00 to SHALVA. So, for every 100 cell phones collected, \$400.00 is raised to support SHALVA's counseling services and programs.

SHALVA is the oldest independent Jewish domestic abuse agency in the United States and has been instrumental in facilitating national and international dialogues on the specific needs of Jewish families experiencing domestic violence. SHALVA carries out its mission by working to create "a zero tolerance" for domestic abuse in the Jewish community.

In 1986, SHALVA's first year of existence, 24 clients were served. Since then, SHALVA has worked with over 4,000 clients from every denomination of Judaism that seek assistance for domestic abuse. Over the years, SHALVA has grown to include free counseling services in the form of crisis-counseling, ongoing individual support and educational groups.

SHALVA works in partnership with domestic abuse agencies throughout the Chicago metropolitan area to increase awareness around culturally-specific Jewish issues and to serve as a resource specializing in Chicago's Jewish population. SHALVA's community education programs reach more than 3,400 people annually throughout the Jewish community and their newsletter is sent to over 19,500 homes biannually. Since 1986, SHALVA volunteers and staff have educated thousands of individuals about violence in Jewish relationships. SHALVA staff trains rabbis, police officers, hospital social workers, camp counselors, teachers, friends and family of victims in order to increase education and community awareness about domestic abuse, to inform the public about SHALVA's counseling and education services, and to promote advocacy around the issue of domestic abuse.

The Greater Chicago Food Depository

As Cook County's food bank, the Greater Chicago Food Depository distributes more than 40 million pounds of food each year to a network of 600 member agencies. Frequent projects involve repackaging bulk cereal or pasta, sorting bread or canned food donations, or cleaning produce.

*Jewish Child and Family Services (JCFS)

Jewish Child and Family Services offers an array of programs serving thousands of children, adults and families throughout the diverse Chicago community each year. Services include: Support for Communities, Counseling and Support, Education, Child Welfare, and Services for People with Disabilities.

*JUF Book Buddies

JUF Book Buddies makes learning about the Jewish holidays fun! Young families gather in three Chicago metro area locations one Sunday a month for creative holiday-themed art projects, sing-alongs and story reading. Events are appropriate for children approximately ages 0-5 years. This year, JUF Book Buddies will take place at bookstores in Vernon Hills, Naperville and Oak Park.

*JUF Uptown Cafe

The Dina and Eli Field EZRA Multi-Service Center coordinates the Cafe under the auspices of the Jewish Community Centers of Chicago. The Cafe, which is the first kosher anti-hunger program in Chicago, provides meals to people who are hungry while at the same time, nourishing their spirits.

Kids Enjoy Exercise Now (KEEN)

KEEN is a volunteer organization that provides free one-on-one recreational opportunities for children and young adults with mental and physical disabilities. At each KEEN session, a participating athlete is paired with a volunteer coach for a variety of age-appropriate recreational activities.

Inspiration Corporation

In an atmosphere of dignity and respect, Inspiration Corporation helps people who are affected by homelessness and poverty to improve their lives and increase self-sufficiency through the provision of social services, employment training and placement, and housing.

The Night Ministry

The Night Ministry works to provide outreach, healthcare, and housing to youth and adults overcoming homelessness in Chicago. It is an interfaith organization that operates four youth shelters, a Health Outreach Bus, and a team of street outreach workers.

Northfield Township Food Pantry

For over 20 years, Northfield Township Food Pantry has helped township residents who have difficulty providing enough food for themselves and their families. The Pantry is sustained entirely by local individuals, community and religious organizations, and schools who donate canned foods, food certificates, and/or funds.

Temple Sholom of Chicago's Monday Meal

Temple Sholom, founded in 1867 and one of Chicago's oldest synagogues, affirms Judaism as a dynamic and motivating force in the lives of its congregants. The Temple sits at the forefront of Reform Judaism educating both young and old, presenting lectures and programs of broad appeal, serving the disadvantaged in the community and helping those searching for new forms of worship and expression within Jewish heritage.

Ronald McDonald House

Ronald McDonald House near Children's Memorial Hospital is a "home away from home" for families of hospitalized children.

Sunrise Assisted Living of Flossmoor

Started in 1981, Sunrise of Flossmoor offers assisted living and a secured area to service and care for seniors and enable them to live life on their terms.

Women In Need Growing Stronger (WINGS)

WINGS is an agency that works with suburban homeless women and children and victims of domestic violence.
