



As part of JUF's French Terror and Security Fund, resources will be meeting the human needs for the victims, their families and the broader Jewish community. Our overseas partners together with the Israel Trauma Coalition have developed the following recommendations:

Immediate Phase Needs

- *Creating a community hotline*
- *Direct care to those who were held hostage and their families as well as to other trauma victims*
- *Resiliency training for Jewish communal professionals*
- *Preparedness and training for principals and counselors at Jewish schools*
- *Disseminating information about available trauma services*
- *Mapping of the needs around Paris and other locations in France*

Second Phase Needs

- *Developing and implementing a plan for services*
- *Preparedness training for Jewish organizations and facilities (schools, old age homes, community centers, etc.)*
- *Preparedness and response training for rabbis*
- *Training clinicians*

JUF supported some similar programs following the attack at the Ozar Hatorah Jewish school in Toulouse, France in 2012, in which three students and a rabbi were murdered.

In addition, JUF's French Terror and Security Fund will:

- *Help the French Jewish community bolster security at Jewish facilities. The French Jewish community will be responsible for 80% of the security expenses and North American philanthropy will be partnering with the local community to provide 20% of these increased expenses.*
- *Cover expanded costs for increased aliyah (immigration to Israel) and absorption of growing numbers of French Jews choosing to move to Israel.*
