SEEKING: Young, successful philanthropic-minded Jewish adults in the Chicagoland area, looking to enrich their lives and the Jewish community by becoming leaders and taking action within a global philanthropic movement.

Chicago Cabinet members are highly-regarded young volunteers who have a seat at the Jewish United Fund table. They receive Cabinet-exclusive experiences, high level meetings with local luminaries and business leaders, and local leadership opportunities.

OVERVIEW: National Young Leadership Cabinet (NYLC) is a five-year program that creates a *chevre* (community) of aspiring young philanthropists and volunteer leaders for the Jewish Federation movement through education, skill development, and programming designed to deepen the understanding of local, national, and global community needs.

Cabinet core program includes:

- Summer retreat for training, networking, and leadership development
- Optional study mission to better understand the needs and challenges of Jewish communities around the world
- Activities at JFNA's General Assembly—the annual conference for Federation lay and professional leaders and their local/overseas partners.

You will enrich and strengthen your skills on a global level, through learning and travel experiences that include meeting local and national leaders, hands-on service opportunities and engaging with people who are impacted by Federation work.

ELIGIBILITY + APPLICATION: Candidates must be between the ages of 30 and 40 in the year they apply to Cabinet, contribute a minimum of \$5,000 annually to their local Federation, have demonstrated leadership in their local community, and be eager for future growth. In addition to being nominated by a professional from their local Federation, prospective candidates must fill out an application stating why they want to participate in this program. After an interview process, candidates are accepted on a rolling basis from end of January through May.
